



Itinerary 14-day fly-in safari Namibia / Zimbabwe / Botswana 2024

Day 1:

After your arrival at Windhoek International Airport you will be picked up and taken to the city. The drive will take approximately 40 minutes. The rest of the day is at your free disposal. If you wish, you can participate in a sightseeing tour of Windhoek (optional). You can have dinner in a restaurant in town or at the guest house.



Accommodation: Olive Grove Guesthouse, B&B (standard room) including transfers.

Day 2:

After breakfast, you will depart for your flight to Fish River Canyon at 9:00 a.m. The flight will take approximately 2 hours. Upon arrival, you will have a short ride to the lodge. Then, optionally, you can have lunch at the lodge, followed by a siesta where you can use the facilities of the lodge. The Fish River Lodge is located directly at the edge of the upper canyon and thus offers spectacular views over the canyon from all bungalows as well as the main building.





In the afternoon, a "nature drive" is planned in an open 4x4 SUV in the area surrounding the lodge. Departure is at about 4:00 p.m. From various vantage points you can enjoy the view over the canyon. At sunset, a sundowner drink is served in an exposed location. The return to the lodge is shortly after sunset.

Meals are taken at the lodge.

Day 3:

After breakfast, you will be taken to the airport. The departure of your flight is scheduled for 9:00 a.m. After take-off we will fly along the canyon and then on to Lüderitz. The view of the canyon is breathtaking. The meandering loops are easily recognizable from the air. The flight duration will be approximately 1:10 hrs.



After landing, a driver will be waiting for you to visit the ghost town Kolmannskuppe. Here you will take part in a guided tour of the museum. Afterwards you will be taken to the city, where you can have a lunch at a restaurant (optional). On your way to the airport, you will take a short city tour through Lüderitz. At 3:00 p.m. the flight to the Sossusvlei region will depart. The flight time will be approximately 50 minutes.



The transfer to the lodge will take about 5 minutes. The rest of the afternoon is at your free disposal.

The Lodge is located at the entrance to the Namib-Naukluft National Park between the dune corridor and the outskirts leading to the Namibian Plateau. The location is suited perfectly as a starting point for excursions to Sossusvlei.

Meals will be served at the lodge. Accommodation: Sossusvlei Lodge, DB&B incl. transfers and city-tour Lüderitz

Day 4:

In the early morning we will undertake a trip to the dunes of Sossusvlei. We will leave the lodge before dawn in a 4x4 SUV. During the ride we will be able to enjoy the sunrise. This time of the day is best for observing the shadow play on the dunes.



We will arrive at Sossusvlei approximately after an hour. Upon arrival you will have the possibility to walk to the dunes. A 20-minute walk leads to the most scenic area of the region: the Deadvlei, offering many spectacular photo opportunities. In the late morning, before it gets too hot, we will leave the region again.

The return to the lodge is planned for approximately noon. The afternoon will be at your free disposal.

Accommodation: Sossusvlei Lodge, DB&B, (standard room) incl. transfers und drive to Sossusvlei.

Day 5:

After a late breakfast we will leave the lodge at about 9:15 a.m. Today's flight to Swakopmund takes you to the Atlantic coast. This flight route is one of Namibia's most spectacular one's. After overflying the Sossusvlei region we will cross the dunes in northwest direction. Descending, we will pass the abandoned diamond camps. Once we reach the coast, we will see numerous seal colonies on the beach. The Eduard Bohlen shipwreck is one of the best preserved along the Namibian coast.



Travelling further north we will pass a further shipwreck, the Shaunee, on our way to Sandwich Bay. Here you will find a large bird colony during breeding season including pelicans, flamingos and the local Damara tern. After passing the salt pans of Walvis Bay,



you reach Swakopmund. After a "fly by" along the skyline of this coastal city we will land. You will have a short ride to the city, where you will arrive at about noon.



The afternoon is at your free disposal. You can easily explore the city and its sights on your own. Although only about 5 percent of the population are of German descent, their influence on city life is unmistakable. Swakopmund is still regarded as the "most German" city in Namibia, and the renaming of original German street names into "contemporary African" has changed little to this fact. The unique mixture of German influenced seaside resort, African population and spectacular dune landscape make Swakopmund a popular destination for group tours as well as individually travelling tourists. Also, residents of the capital Windhoek like to flee here from the great summer heat, as evidenced by the lively construction activity having led to growth of the city to the north.

Dinner may be (optionally) taken at a restaurant in the city.

Accommodation: Strandhotel Swakopmund , B&B, (standard room) incl. transfers.

Day 6:

After breakfast we will take off at 9:30 a.m. towards the airport of Swakopmund. Take off to Damaraland is scheduled for 10:30 a.m. We will fly along the coastal region in northern direction. After passing some small settlements, the flight then passes by the village of Henties Bay. After about 30 minutes flight time we will pass the seal colony at Cape Cross. During breeding season up to 400,000 seals settle here. From there on the flight will lead inland past the Brandberg Mountain, the highest mountain in Namibia. With a height of 2,578 meters, it rises as a so-called island-mountain from the desert.

After an hour of flying we will reach Damaraland. We will land on the Twyfelfontein airstrip. Here, a driver will be awaiting you. The transfer to the lodge takes about 25 minutes. Arrival is scheduled for approximately 12:30 p.m.

You can have lunch at the lodge (optional).



The afternoon is at your free disposal. There are wonderful hiking routes around the lodge. Afterwards you can have a sundowner drink! Dinner will be served at the lodge. After dinner you can end the day next to a campfire and view the wonderful starlit sky.

Accommodation: Mowani Mountain Camp, DB&B (standard room) incl. transfers

Day 7:

After an early breakfast you will leave the camp at about 8:00 a.m. With a 4x4 SUV you will be taken to the Huab dry river in search of the desert elephants. These are only found in this part of Namibia. In search of water, they walk enormous distances and have adapted to the local conditions.



The trip will take about 4 hours. Afterwards we will not return to the camp but will drive directly to the airfield of Damaraland Camp. Your luggage will be transferred directly from the camp. At about 12:30 p.m. we will start our flight to the east side of the Etosha National Park. The flight duration is about 1:10 hours. The flight route passes over the southern part of Etosha National Park. A short transfer with an SUV brings us to Mushara lodge. After check-in, a wildlife safari in Etosha National Park is planned in the afternoon until sunset.

Dinner will be served at the lodge.

Accommodation: Mushara Lodge, DB&B, (standard room) incl. transfers.

Day 8:

After breakfast before sunrise we will take off for a further wildlife safari in the National Park. With an expansion over 22,275 square km, the Etosha National Park is the largest and most important wildlife preservation area of Namibia. The park is located on the northwest edge of the Kalahari Basin and covers almost the entire 5,000 km² large Etosha pan.





The Etosha National Park is home to a big variety of large animal species. Apart from crocodiles, hippos, waterbucks and buffalos, nearly all large animals of southern Africa can be found here.

Since the fencing in 1973 it is not possible for the animals to leave the park – they depend on the nourishment the park has to offer.



In Etosha the following number of different species have been identified so far:

- 114 species of mammals,
- 340 species of birds,
- 110 species of reptiles,
- 16 species of amphibians and one species of fish.

The return to the lodge will be at around 12:30 p.m. Optionally you can have lunch à la carte at the lodge. The afternoon is at your free disposal. If you wish, you can participate in a further wildlife safari (optional). Alternatively, you can use the facilities of the lodge.

The lodge consists of 10 spacious chalets. Mushara is the native name of a Terminalia tree which can be found in large numbers on the grounds of the lodge. A large swimming pool invites you to linger.

Dinner will be served in the lodge or in the Boma restaurant, under the open sky.

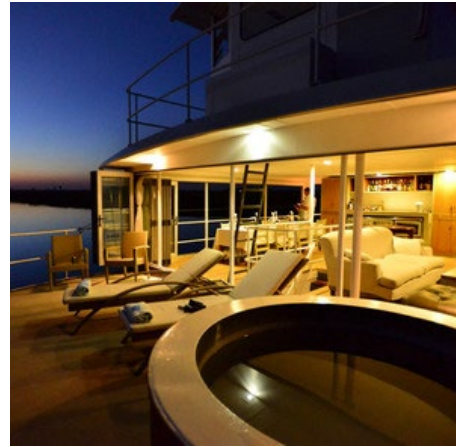

Day 9:

After breakfast we leave the lodge and start at 9:00 a.m. for our flight to Rundu. The flight time will be about 1 hour. Here the aircraft will be refueled. The subsequent flight heads east along the Caprivi strip to Impalila Island. During the flight we will cross the Kavango River. In the further course also the Kwando river. We will pass the Linyanti marshes north to follow the Chobe River to Impalila Island before landing. The flight time will be about 2 hours.

After landing, a short transfer to the port of the island follows. From here we take a tender boat to our safari boat. There will be plenty of wildlife to see during the ride. A light lunch is served on the safari boat. Then the safari boat relocates to a new mooring. Travelling time is approximately 2 hours. After mooring, wild animals can be seen on the shore until sunset with the tender boat.



Meals are served on the safari boat.

Accommodation: Chobe Princess Safari boat, FI, full board incl. activities, as well as local beverages during meals.

Day 10:

Today can be spent with activities on the river. There are several tender boats available. After breakfast, which is usually taken at 8:00 a.m., you start your first wildlife safari along the riverbank.

The river is adjacent to Chobe National Park on the Botswana side, which is known for having the largest density of elephants in southern Africa. In addition, numerous species of antelope, giraffes, crocodiles and buffalo herds can be seen. Occasionally, predators such as lions and leopards are spotted. With some luck, even larger groups of African wild dogs can be seen here.



Meals are served on the safari boat. After lunch, the boat relocates to another mooring.

Accommodation: Chobe Princess Safariboot, FI, full board incl. activities, as well as local beverages during meals.

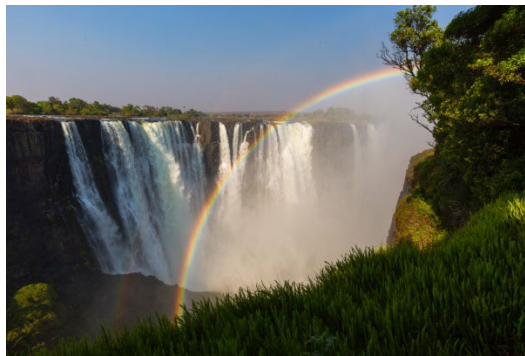
Day 11:

After breakfast, you will leave the safari boat at approximately 08:00 a.m. Upon arrival on Impalila Island, you will complete the departure formalities for Namibia. The following flight follows the course of the river Sambezi up to the Victoria Falls. After 2 full circles over the falls, you will land at Victoria Falls International Airport. Flight time will be about 40 minutes.

After completing the immigration formalities for Zimbabwe, a transfer will take us to the Victoria Falls Hotel.

The cost of the VISA (US \$ 30.00 per person and National Park entrance fee of US \$ 30.00 per person is not included in the price).

Upon arrival, a light lunch (optional) can be taken on the terrace of the hotel. Afterwards you can walk to the approx. 3 km distant Victoria Falls National Park. In the park you follow a footpath of about 1.2 km length from one sightseeing point to the next.





Dinner (optional) can be taken at one of the hotel's restaurants.

Day 12:

After breakfast, another transfer will take us back to Victoria Falls Airport. After completing the departure formalities, the flight follows to Kasane / Botswana. The flight duration is approx. 20 minutes. After entering Botswana, we continue to fly into the Okavango Delta. The flight time is about 1 hour. This flight will take us over Chobe National Park, pass Savuti and continue to the delta. Camp Moremi is located on the northern border of Moremi Game Park.

The arrival time on Xakanaka Runway is expected to be at 1:00 p.m. (Botswana local time). A short transfer in a 4x4 SUV will take you to the lodge. Here, a light lunch can be taken. After a little siesta we will leave for a first wildlife safari in the afternoon.



We will return to the lodge after sunset. The dinner is taken at the camp.

Accommodation: Camp Moremi, FI, full board including activities, as well as local beverages during meals. www.desertdelta.com

Day 13:

In the early morning, you will set off to another wildlife safari in an open 4x4 off-road vehicle. The trip leads to the Moremi Wildlife Park, which is known for its rich biodiversity. In addition to elephants, lions, leopards and cheetahs you will also find zebra herds, hyenas and numerous species of water antelope. In rare cases, you can also see the endangered African wild dog.

The return to the camp will be at about 11:30 a.m.

The camp offers a buffet lunch.

Afterwards, you can spend time at the swimming pool. The well-stocked library offers a wide selection of reading on the Okavango Delta. From a separate observation deck, the surrounding area and its wildlife can be observed.



In the afternoon, you can take a boat trip on the canals of the Okavango Delta. On this motorized boat trip, an experienced guide drives the aluminum boat past hippos and herds of elephants. During the excursion you can also observe the diverse bird life in the delta. In addition to many different species of eagles, storks, herons and bee-eaters can also be spotted.

The return to the camp will be shortly after sunset.

The dinner is taken at the camp.

Accommodation: Camp Moremi, FI full board incl. activities, as well as local beverages during meals.

Day 14:

Today begins with another boat trip to the Okavango Delta. This is followed by a late breakfast at the camp. At about 11:00 a.m. we will fly to Maun. The flight time will be approximately 30 minutes. The flight route runs from north to south across the entire Okavango Delta. You will be able to see Chiefs Island, which was a private hunting ground of King Moremi before he handed the island over to the state authorities.

In Maun we will handle the departure formalities for Botswana. The aircraft will be refueled and the subsequent flight to Windhoek will lead westward across the Kalahari. During the flight we will cross the border to Namibia after about 1 hour's flight. Shortly before landing at the City Airport Windhoek / Eros we pass Windhoek International Airport. The flight time will be about 2.5 hours.

After landing, we will take care of the immigration formalities for Namibia.
